## SLSO+Community Impact

For more than 140 years, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra has been a treasured cultural institution, an education leader, and a musical ambassador for the region. The SLSO is committed to connecting the community, making music accessible to all through live concerts, free events, music education programs, radio broadcasts, and digital content.

In the 2022/2023 season, the SLSO made an impact in St. Louis and around the world:

- 215,000+ people experienced the SLSO live at Powell Hall and across the region
- 300+ concerts, free events, and education programs during the season
- 50+ community partners ranging from universities to houses of worship, schools, social service agencies, nonprofit organizations, and cultural institutions
- 329,000+ students and 1,500+ teachers reached by the SLSO's education programs
- Students and teachers in 49 states and 8 countries connected with SLSO education programs
- **480,000+ people** reached on weekly radio broadcasts on St. Louis Public Radio and Classic 107.3 FM.



**Did you know?** For fourteen years, the SLSO has partnered with Maryville University Music Therapy and St. Louis Arc for Creative Music Making, a program that empowers adults with disabilities to conceive and perform their own concert. In February 2023, participants performed on the Powell Hall stage with SLSO musicians for an "All You Need is Love" themed concert.
