

The St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra, founded in 1970 by Conductor Laureate Leonard Slatkin, is the preeminent training ensemble for the region's talented, hard-working young musicians. Students take on the challenge of advanced orchestral repertoire, receive mentorship from SLSO musicians, and rehearse and perform on stage.

- 120+ young musician members
- 45+ schools with participating students

- 3 free concerts annually
- 20% of YO musicians receive scholarship support; no students are turned away
