

For more than 140 years, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra has been a treasured cultural institution, an education leader, and a musical ambassador for the region. The SLSO is committed to our St. Louis community by making music accessible to all through live concerts, free events, music education programs, radio broadcasts, and digital content.

In the 2023/2024 season, the SLSO made an impact in St. Louis and around the world:

- 226,000+ people experienced the SLSO live at venues across the region
- 230+ concerts, free events, and education programs during the season
- 130+ community partners ranging from universities to houses of worship, social service agencies, nonprofit organizations, and cultural institutions
- 449,000+ students and 1,300+ teachers reached by the SLSO's education programs
- Students and teachers in 49 states and 13 countries connected with SLSO education programs
- 306,000+ people reached on weekly radio broadcasts on St. Louis Public Radio and Classic 107.3 FM



Did you know? The SLSO offers dozens of performances each season throughout the St. Louis area in schools, houses of worship, healthcare facilities, and in public spaces. In June 2024, 3,000 people gathered to hear the SLSO perform in Lakeside Park in St. Peters. the first time in the city's history the park has reached capacity. Hundreds of community members brought instruments to play along with the SLSO for the evening's finale Ode to Joy.
